The Climate Registry (TCR) was established by states, tribes, and provinces in North America as a mechanism to measure entity-wide greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions across industry sectors and borders with transparency, credibility, comprehensiveness, and consistency. TCR is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization governed by a board of directors from 39 U.S. states, four Canadian provinces, and two Mexican states. TCR’s accounting infrastructure supports voluntary, regulatory, and market-based GHG programs, and TCR encourages voluntary early actions to increase energy efficiency and decrease GHG emissions. During this seminar, Michelle Manion will discuss the efforts of TCR, which is in the process of developing protocols for general reporting and verification of GHG emissions as well as a software tool to support emissions reporting. The anticipated rollout of TCR is January 2008, with reporting starting in March 2008.

Michelle Manion is the program manager of the Climate and Energy team at Northeast States for Coordinated Air Use Management (NESCAUM)/Northeast States Center for a Clean Air Future (NESCCAF), where she works closely with the New England states, New York, and New Jersey to support their efforts on state and regional energy, climate, and air quality policy and programs. Prior to NESCAUM, Manion was with the Global Environment Program at the Union of Concerned Scientists (UCS) and has worked as an environmental consultant for a variety of governmental, industry, and nonprofit clients including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the U.S. Department of the Interior, the World Bank, the World Commission on Dams, and Conservation International. Manion has master’s degrees in natural resources and in economics and public policy from the University of Michigan; and a bachelor’s in economics from Bucknell University.
