Activity 3: Setting Performance Goals

Discussion Questions:

- Given the interdependencies and vulnerabilities identified, which shared infrastructure systems may likely be impacted in the next 20 to 30 years? How does the interruption to these infrastructure systems impact the multiple jurisdictions and government operations?
- Who is responsible as the owner and operator of these infrastructure systems?
- What is the current recovery time for system-wide infrastructure recovery? What are performance goals for accelerated system-wide recovery?
- What are the gaps and barriers that exist between current recovery time and the performance goal, including resources, policies, agreements, technology gaps, human capacity and system integration?
